

BIRZEIT UNVIERSITY SPORTS HALL

Over a century, what began as a small girls' school in Birzeit town has become the most prestigious
Palestinian university, transforming
Palestinian higher education through



its impact on community awareness, culture and resistance.

Birzeit University has been a thorn in the side of the occupation, insisting on playing its role of enlightenment and creating a multicultural Palestinian society on the campus grounds.

Bethlehem, "House of Bread"
Bethleem; is a city in the central West
Bank, Palestine, about 10 km (6.2 miles)
south of Jerusalem. Its population is
approximately 25,000, and it is the capital
of the Bethlehem Governorate. The
important holy site of Rachel's Tomb is at
the northern entrance of Bethlehem.

Church and Grotto of the Nativity

The first thing that comes to mind when thinking of Bethlehem is the Church of the Nativity. This church, which is beautifully decorated, is famous for being home to the Grotto of the Nativity, said to be the place where Mary gave birth to Jesus — though even the rest of the church is interesting to visit.

The church was built upon orders of Constantine's mother Helena in 339 AD. Destroyed and rebuilt several times, the church is quite large and airy, with some beautiful mosaics – some discovered after renovation works in 1934.

The grotto is quite small. There are a few

steps to get to it. Once inside, you will see that there is a 14-point star, which marks the place where Mary gave birth to Jesus; and the manger where Jesus was placed. The Grotto of the Nativity is regularly packed with people chanting or praying – for religious people this is a highly spiritual experience. For Atheists like me, it's an interesting historical place to visit.

TIP: There are normally lines to get to the actual grotto – so make sure to visit first thing in the morning. The church is inevitably more crowded during Christmas time.

TIP: Make sure to also visit St. Catherine's Church, which is right next to the Church of the Nativity.

The Church and Grotto of the Nativity are much better visited on a guided tour: you really need a guide to help you through the crowds and to make sense of what you are seeing. Read above for the recommended tours. Chapel of the Milk Grotto

Significantly less visited (we were the only ones there when we went) than the Church of the Nativity, this lovely chapel was built in the 19th century around the Grotto where the Holy Family stayed to preserve baby Jesus from Herod's massacre of the innocents. According to legend, some drops of milk fell from the Virgin Mary and turned the rock inside the grotto completely white. Nowadays, this is a place of worship especially for couples looking to conceive a child.

Shepherd's Field

Another place to visit in Bethlehem for Christians is Shepherd's Field – thought to be the place where the angels announced the birth of Jesus to the shepherds. It's located a bit outside the center of Bethlehem, in a beautiful, quiet park where you will find a Greek Orthodox church and a catholic one built to remind the structure of the tent where the shepherds would spend the night. Below this, there is a grotto with a small chapel.

Jericho is a Palestinian city in the West Bank. It is located in the Jordan Valley, with the Jordan River to the east and Jerusalem to the west.

Commonly known as "the oldest city in the world," Jericho is an important historical, cultural, and political center located northwest of the Dead Sea.

The surroundings of Jericho are gorgeous though – lots of hiking trails, and a couple of monasteries which include the Monastery of Temptation, said to be the place where Jesus spent 40 days and nights praying and fasting



while he was being tempted by Satan. The monastery can be reached via cable car and from there you can get incredible views of the Dead Sea and of Jericho.

Baptismal Site on the Jordan River

This is the site where, according to Christian tradition, Jesus was baptized. Marking the border between the West Bank and Jordan, this is a very important place for Christians, who go there on pilgrimages and immerse themselves in the water to be baptized. You will find several fonts of water – you'll see many people refilling their bottles, which they often take home to offer to their friends and relatives who were unable to travel.

Ramallah is a must when you visit Palestine. This the biggest and most cosmopolitan (as well as chaotic) city in Palestine. It's a fun place to spend a few hours, usually the starting point of guided tours of the West Bank. The most interesting place to visit is Arafat Mausoleum and Museum, where you will be able to learn a bit more about the history of Palestine.

On the grounds of his final battle, connected to his main office and last command headquarters, stands the **Yasser Arafat Museum**. Overlooking his temporary mausoleum in Al-Muqata'a, the Museum bears witness to the legendary farewell of Palestinians amid the inspirational symbols and profound, eternal memories of the space – a museum of the Palestinian contemporary national memory.

Jerusalem

The Holy City of Jerusalem is perhaps the most significant, and almost certainly the best-known religious city on Earth. In no other single place can you find such a concentration of sites sacred to not just one, but three major world religions: Christianity, Judaism, and Islam. This compact ancient city, surrounded

by a wall more than 450 years ago. By tradition this, the holiest place for Catholic and Orthodox Christians marks the site of Jesus' crucifixion, burial, and Resurrection. It was completed in A.D. 335, its basilica having been constructed on the foundations of an ancient Roman temple to Venus (Aphrodite). The actual sepulcher is inside the Edicule, a two-room chapel underneath the church's rotunda. There are separate prayer times for the various denominations.

The Via Dolorosa is the road Jesus walked from the place of Pontius Pilate's sentencing to Golgotha (the location of the crucifixion) and is the most sacred Christian byway in the world. Of the 14 stations, which Christians have been walking for more than a thousand years, the most famous is the Praetorium, where Jesus took up the cross and the Church of the Holy Sepulcher.

Those walking the Via Dolorosa—which means "way of sorrows"—symbolically relive the moments of Christ's Passion.





Jerusalem's al-Aqsa Mosque is the third-holiest site in Islam, drawing tens of thousands of pilgrims from across Palestine and the wider Muslim world each year.

Spanning 14 hectares, the mosque includes the golden-domed Dome of the Rock, arguably one of Jerusalem's most recognizable landmarks, as well as the ancient al-Qibli Mosque, both of which are considered sacred.

The huge site, also known as Haram al-Sharif, or "noble sanctuary," in Arabic, traditionally had 15 gates, which allowed worshippers to pour into its grounds from the surrounding Old City of Jerusalem.
