10th OPEN TURIN CUP INTERNATIONAL 2022



KARATE. Una valida selezione per i Mondiali in Turchia "Open Turin Cup" onorata da 850 atleti A Leini prevale la Master Rapid Skf Cbl

Ben 850 atleti si sono cimentati lo scorso weekend nella 10ª "Open Turin Cup" di karate, valevole come selezione per i Mondiali di Konya (Turchia) dal 26 al 30 ottobre, al Palasport Maggiore di Leini.

Nella prima giornata spazio al kumite (il combattimento) e nel secondo al kata (le forme). Nel medagliere è stata l'Italia a fare la parte del leone con 234 piazzamenti sul podio (65 ori, 62 argenti e 107 bronzi); al Belgio sono andati 3 ori, 4 argenti e 2 bronzi; alla Francia 2 ori, 2 argenti e 6 bronzi; alla Spagna, infine, 2 argenti e 2 bronzi. Scorrendo la classifica dei club, il migliore in assoluto è stato il Master Rapid Skf Cbl di Piancamuno (Bs) con 23 medaglie (6 d'oro, 8 d'argento e 9 di bronzo); il 2° posto è andato all'Olimpia Karate Bergamo, accreditata di 5 ori e 2 argenti, e il 3° al Team Karate Puleo Firenze, che ha messo insieme un bottino di 5 ori, un argento e 4 bronzi. Il primo sodalizio piemontese è 4°, il torinese Talarico Karate Team (4 ori, 7 argenti e 13 bronzi), mentre quello straniero più performante lo si incontra al 5° posto, l'Académie Karate Bruxelles del Belgio, salito per 3 volte sul gradino più alto alle premiazioni, per 4 volte sul 2° gradino e per 5 volte sul 3°.

Presenti nel weekend per il Comitato regionale Fijlkam: il presidente Fabrizio Marchetti e la vicepresidente per il settore karate Patrizia Giordanengo; il direttore tecnico Luca Valdesi; due campioni mondiali, Salvatore Loria e Stefano Maniscalco; e per il Comune di Leini il sindaco Renato Pittalis e l'assessore allo sport Mauro Caudana.

Commenta il maestro Omar Rhezuani, responsabile dell'organizzazione fin dalla prima edizione del 1998 a Settimo: «È stata una bellissima gara: tutti ne sono rimasti contenti e non si è infortunato nessuno, a dimostrazione che il karate, ora sport olimpico, non è uno sport violento».
