The Richmond Olympic Oval is Metro Vancouver's premier indoor multi-sport arena and fitness facility. Originally built to host long track speed skating events during the Vancouver 2010 Olympic Winter Games, this facility now features two Olympic-sized hockey rinks, multi-sport courts, basketball courts, a climbing wall, and a fitness centre.

1.3.1 Getting to the Venue & Parking

The Richmond Olympic Oval is only 10 minutes by ground transportation from Vancouver International Airport (YVR).

Translink Bus Route 414 runs between the Richmond Olympic Oval and Richmond-Brighouse Canada Line Station Monday through Saturday.

1.5 Introduction

Karate BC is proud to present the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships. This event will once again take place at the beautiful Richmond Olympic Oval near the Vancouver International Airport (YVR) from April 6-7, 2024, and is expected to assemble over 400 athletes from across British Columbia. This tournament also serves as one of two selection events for Elite athletes who are seeking to qualify for a spot on the Karate BC Team, which will represent British Columbia at the 2024 Karate Canada National Championships in Laval, Québec this July.

Karate BC is the recognized Provincial Sport Organization (PSO) for Karate in British Columbia.



1.6 Purpose

The purpose of this Information Bulletin is to provide important information regarding the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships to athletes, coaches, officials, and volunteers, to assist them in preparing to participate in this event. All participants are asked to carefully read this document in its entirety before registering for this tournament.

1.10 Commitment to Sustainability

The 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championship is committed to fostering positive environmental, social, and economic impacts for current and future generations within the local community.

Karate BC will ensure the sustainability of its events by:

- eliminating the distribution of single-use plastic water bottles, and instead encouraging volunteers and referees to bring their own reusable water bottles to be filled at the event's water bottle refilling station,
- encouraging referees and volunteers to bring their own travel mugs for coffee/tea to minimize the amount of paper cups used,
- encouraging walking, carpooling, and the use of public transportation to travel to and from the event whenever possible,
- minimizing the use of printed documents to the extent possible in favour of electronic documents, and using FSC-certified paper when printed documents are necessary, and
- producing event banners, signage, and other marketing materials in a manner that enables their reuse in multiple events whenever possible.



1.11 Errors and Omissions

Karate BC reserves the right to correct errors and omissions in this Information Bulletin.



2. PARTICIPANT CODE OF CONDUCT

Karate BC accepts all language contained in the British Columbia Universal Code of Conduct (BC UCC), and is committed to providing sport environments that are free from all forms of harm, including sexual, physical, mental, emotional, and psychological harm.

All participants at the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships, including athletes, coaches, referees, and volunteers, must read, agree to, and adhere to the BC UCC at all times at this event.

The code of conduct agreement is incorporated into the required participant documents online form (see section 7.5).



The BC UCC is designed to raise awareness of the responsibilities of all participants in sport, including athletes, coaches, referees, volunteers, spectators, and staff, to contribute to a safe environment, and to raise awareness of prohibited behaviours or conduct.

Every participant has a responsibility to:

- Make sure their intentions, actions and efforts put priority on the safety of all Participants.
- Treat others with respect and dignity.
- Promote sportsmanship, leadership, and ethical conduct.
- Respect the diversity of Participants and reject discrimination.
- Treat individuals fairly and reasonably.
- Follow the rules of the sport, and the spirit of the rules.
- Report any acts or suspicions of inappropriate behaviours or other Maltreatment.
- Make sure all individuals feel included.



- Accept feedback about their own behaviours, and work to correct problems.
- Establish, respect, and maintain appropriate boundaries with Participants.
- Make sure that interactions respect the role of every Participant in the sport.
- Make sure that individual accountability is promoted during interactions.
- Make sure that interactions are transparent and easily understood by both Participants and outside observers.
- Monitor their own behaviours, and the behaviours of others.
- Take seriously all reports, allegations, and suspicions of Maltreatment.
- Identify and participate in conversations that lead to positive behaviour change.
- Do not take part in any Prohibited Behaviours.

All participants in a position of trust or authority have a responsibility to:

- Protect the health and well-being of all other Participants.
- Prevent or reduce opportunities for Maltreatment and other Prohibited Behaviours.
- Respond to any Maltreatment involving Minors and other Vulnerable Participants.
- Learn to recognize systemic bias, unconscious bias, and to respond quickly and effectively to Discriminatory practices.
- Recognize when you are in a position of Power Imbalance.

It is a violation of the BC Universal Code of Conduct to engage in:

- Psychological Maltreatment including Verbal Conduct such as yelling; Non-assaultive physical conduct such as throwing items; or behaviours restricting attention or support, such as abandoning an athlete as punishment for poor performance.
- Physical Maltreatment including Contact behaviours such as deliberately hitting someone; or Non-contact behaviours such as the use of exercise for the purposes of punishment.
- Sexual Maltreatment of Minors or Adult participants, including Criminal Code offenses; and any comment or conduct of a sexual nature that is unwelcome or that would be objectively perceived as unwelcome by an outside observer.
- Grooming which can include one or several acts that, viewed objectively, make it easier to either engage in Sexual Maltreatment or reduce the chance that Sexual Maltreatment will be reported.
- Boundary Transgressions which include a wide range of activities such as communicating privately with a Minor through social media or text; or one-on-one meetings that are not held in an open and observable environment.



- Neglect such as not providing an athlete recovery time and/or treatment for a sport injury.
- Discrimination such as denying someone access to participating in sport or treating them unfairly.
- Subjecting a Participant to the Risk of Maltreatment such as putting Participants in situations that could obviously make them vulnerable to Maltreatment.
- Aiding and Abetting which includes any action intended to result in Maltreatment by or against a Participant.
- Failure to Report possible Maltreatment, Prohibited Behaviour, or Boundary Transgressions toward a Minor or an Adult Participant.
- Intentionally Filing a False Allegation or influencing someone else to file one. Making a False Allegation is different from an Unsubstantiated Allegation, which is where an allegation is made honestly but there's not enough evidence to prove it. Honestly made Unsubstantiated Allegations are not prohibited actions.
- Interference with or Manipulation of Process such as knowingly falsifying, distorting, misrepresenting, concealing, or destroying information with the intent to influence the proceedings or outcome of the resolution process.
- Retaliation including threats, intimidation, harassment, coercion, or any other behaviour that would discourage a reasonable person from participating in an investigation or disciplinary review processes at any point in the process, and regardless of outcome.



3. SAFE SPORT

Karate BC is committed to fostering a safe and inclusive sporting environment and event experience that is free of abuse, harassment, or discrimination for all participants, including athletes, coaches, referees, volunteers, spectators, and staff.

3.1 Abuse-Free Sport Helpline

The Abuse-Free Sport Helpline is a free, anonymous, confidential, and independent service available in both of Canada's official languages for victims and witnesses of abuse, harassment, or discrimination in a sport environment. This helpline is available 7 days a week from 5 a.m. to 5 p.m. PT.

4. COMPETITOR ELIGIBILITY

4.1 Eligibility

Only competitors who are current members of Karate BC in good standing are eligible to register and participate in the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships.

4.2 Age Eligibility

4.2.1 Kobudo and Non-Elite Categories

The age eligibility for all Kobudo and non-Elite categories at this event is determined by the age of the competitor as of the first date of the event, April 6, 2024. In other words, competitors may register for any Kobudo and non-Elite categories for which they are eligible based on their age as of April 6, 2024.

4.2.1.1 Masters Categories

Competitors who are 40 years of age or older as of April 6, 2024, are eligible to register in Masters categories. Competitors who register in Masters categories may also register in non-Masters categories for which they are eligible based on their gender and skill level, subject to the policy on registering in both a non-Elite category and an Elite category (section 4.3.1).

4.2.1.2 Non-Elite "Women's" and "Men's" Categories

Competitors who are 16 years of age or older as of April 6, 2024, are eligible to register in "Women's" or "Men's" Kata categories for which they are eligible based on their gender and skill level. Competitors who are 18 years of age or older as of April 6, 2024, are eligible to register in "Women's" or "Men's" Kumite categories for which they are eligible based on their gender and skill level.

4.2.1.3 Kobudo and Non-Elite "Adult" Categories

Competitors who are 16 years of age or older as of April 6, 2024, are eligible to register in non-Elite "Adult" Team Kata categories. Competitors who are 18 years



of age or older as of April 6, 2024 are eligible to register in "Adult" Kobudo categories.

4.2.2 Elite Categories

The age eligibility for all Elite categories at this event is determined as follows:

- For U14 (Youth) categories, the age eligibility is determined by the age of the competitor on the first day of the 2024 PKF Junior, Cadet & U21 Championships, expected to be August 22, 2024. In addition, competitors must be at least 12 years of age as of the first day of the 2024 Karate Canada National Championships, July 4, 2024. In other words, competitors may register for U14 (Youth) categories at this event if they will be 12 or 13 years of age as of August 22, 2024, and are at least 12 years of age as of July 4, 2024.
- For Cadet, Junior, and U21 categories, the age eligibility is determined by the age of the competitor on the first day of the 2024 PKF Junior, Cadet & U21 Championships, expected to be August 22, 2024, and the first day of the 2024 WKF World Cadet, Junior & U21 Championships, expected to be October 9, 2024. In other words, competitors may register in all Cadet, Junior, and U21 categories for which they will be eligible based on their age as of August 22, 2024 and their age as of October 9, 2024.
- For Senior categories, the age eligibility is determined by the age of the competitor on the first day of the 2024 Karate Canada National Championships, July 4, 2024.

Please refer to the Competitor Age Eligibility Matrix for the 2024 Karate Canada National Championships in <u>appendix 2</u> of this Information Bulletin for more information.

4.2.3 Para Categories

The age eligibility for all Para categories at this event is determined as follows:

- For U12 Para categories, the age eligibility is determined by the age of the competitor on the first day of the event, April 6, 2024.
- For Junior (U16) Para categories, the age eligibility is determined by the age of the competitor on the first day of the 2024 Karate Canada National Championships, July 4, 2024. In other words, competitors may register for Junior



(U16) Para categories at this event if they will be between 12 and 15 years of age (inclusive) as of July 4, 2024.

• For Senior Para categories, the age eligibility is determined by the age of the competitor on the first day of the 2024 Karate Canada National Championships, July 4, 2024. In other words, competitors may register for Senior Para categories at this event if they will be 16 years of age or older as of July 4, 2024.

Please refer to the Competitor Age Eligibility Matrix for the 2024 Karate Canada National Championships in <u>appendix 2</u> of this Information Bulletin for more information.

4.3 Competition Skill Levels

The following skills levels will be offered at this event:

- A. Novice
- B. Intermediate
- C. Advanced
- D. Black Belt
- E. Elite

Novice, Intermediate, Advanced, and Black Belt categories are classified as non-Elite categories. They may be identified by a division code that starts with "R".

Elite categories may be identified by a division code that starts with "E".

4.3.1 Registering in both a non-Elite Category and an Elite Category

Within the Kata (including Individual Kata and Team Kata) and Kumite events offered at the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships, competitors may choose to register in non-Elite categories <u>or</u> Elite categories, but <u>they are not permitted to register in</u> <u>both a non-Elite category and an Elite category within the same event</u>.

For example, a competitor may register in a non-Elite Individual Kata category and an Elite Individual Kumite category, since Kata and Kumite are separate events. However, a competitor is not permitted to register in a non-Elite Individual Kata category and an Elite Individual Kata category, or vice versa. As an additional example, competitors are not permitted to register in non-Elite Team Kata and Elite Individual Kata, or vice versa.



4.3.2 Non-Elite Competition Skill Level Table

The table below indicates the non-Elite competition skill levels based on the Kyu levels of different Karate styles. **Non-Elite competitors may only register in the skill level that corresponds to their Kyu level**.

4.4 Team Kata

Each competitor may only be part of one (1) Kata Team at the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships.

4.5 Kumite Weight Categories

Competitors may only register in one (1) Kumite weight category within an age group.



5. COACHES

5.1 Eligibility

All coaches must be current members of Karate BC in good standing to be eligible to register as a coach at the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships. All coaches who wish to coach on the field-of-play at the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships must be registered and accredited.

5.2 Requirements for Non-Elite Coaches

Non-Elite coaches are **only permitted to coach on Day 1** (non-elite categories) of the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships.

All non-Elite coaches must have:

- A. A current completed Criminal Record Check (including vulnerable sector check) on file with Karate BC,
- B. Completed the NCCP Making Headway in Sport module through their NCCP locker,
- C. Completed the Coaching Association of Canada's Safe Sport Training module through their NCCP locker.
- D. Audited or completed a Karate BC Referee Certification course, and/or attended a 1-hour rules update by Chief Referee Trevor Walmsley on Sunday, March 17 from 12:00 p.m. 1:00 p.m. for non-elite coaches.

E. Access to a Mentor Coach who is at minimum Comp-Intro Trained and registered as a coach at this event. This mentor coach must be available on-site at the tournament for the non-Elite coach if they have questions and/or concerns during the tournament.

5.3 Requirements for Elite Coaches

Elite coaches are eligible to coach for both days of the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships.



All Elite coaches must have:

- A. A current completed Criminal Record Check (including vulnerable sector check) on file with Karate BC,
- B. At minimum, Competition-Introduction Trained status in the NCCP,
- C. Completed the NCCP Making Headway in Sport module through their NCCP locker,
- D. Completed the Coaching Association of Canada's Safe Sport Training module through their NCCP locker.
- E. Audited or completed a Karate BC Referee Certification course and/or attended a 1-hour rules update by Chief Referee Trevor Walmsley on Sunday, March 17 from 1:30 p.m. 2:30 p.m. for elite coaches.

5.4 Accreditation Agreement for Coaches

All coaches must read, agree to, and electronically sign the Karate BC Accreditation Agreement for Coaches in order to be eligible to receive their accreditation card and coach on the field of play. An accreditation card is required to access the field of play at the event. Coaches must adhere to the Karate BC Coaching Accreditation Agreement at all times during this event.

The Accreditation Agreement for Coaches is incorporated into the required participant documents online form (see section 7.5).

5.5 Attire

All coaches must wear a dojo, provincial or national tracksuit during the competition. Please note that suits/dresses will not be required for medal rounds at this event.



6. REFEREES

6.1 Eligibility

Only referees who are current members of Karate BC in good standing and who possess a current Karate BC licence may register and officiate at the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships.



7. REGISTRATION

7.1 Sportdata Online Registration

Registration for all athletes, coaches, and referees will be completed online through Sportdata.

Participants must provide all required participant information and submit the required registration fees for this event before the registration deadline for registration to be considered complete.

We strongly recommend coaches/team managers to register competitors on behalf of their team/club to ensure competitors are registered accurately and to reduce the likelihood of competitors from the same club meeting in earlier rounds.

A competitor profile must be created through the Sportdata account prior to registering the competitor for the event. All new entries will first be placed on the waiting list. After the registration fee payment is made through PayPal, the entry will be approved automatically. If payment is not made within 60 minutes, the entry will automatically be removed from the waiting list.

7.2 Registration Deadlines

7.2.1 Competitors

- A. The early bird competitor registration deadline has been extended to Monday, March 11, 2024 at 11:59 p.m. PT.
- B. The final competitor registration deadline is Friday, March 22, 2024 at 11:59 p.m. PT.



7.2.2 Coaches

A. The coach registration deadline is Friday, March 22, 2024 at 11:59 p.m. PT.

7.2.3 Referees

A. The referee registration deadline is Friday, March 29, 2024 at 11:59 p.m. PT.

****IMPORTANT:** No participant registrations will be accepted after the respective registration deadline.

7.3 Changes to Competitor Registration

Competitors may make changes to registration free of charge through Sportdata until the final registration deadline on March 22, 2024. Any difference in registration fees will apply.

After the final registration deadline, competitors may change the event category/categories for which they are registered by submitting a registration change request online or at the latest, during the designated accreditation period(s). A registration change fee will apply (please see section 7.4.2).

No changes to non-elite categories will be accepted after the accreditation period on Friday, April 5, 2024. No changes to elite categories will be accepted after the accreditation period on Saturday, April 6, 2024.

7.4 Registration Fees

7.4.1 Competitors

The competitor registration fees for the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships are indicated in the tables below. Competitors who register in more than one individual category will receive a 20% discount on their registration fees for their second and subsequent individual categories.

*= Team Kata categories will not be considered as a "first category" for the purpose of obtaining a registration fee discount for additional categories. For example, if a competitor registers in a Team Kata category and an Individual Kata category, the competitor will be charged the "first category" registration rate for the Individual Kata category. Team Kata categories are also not eligible for the 20% discount.

7.4.2 Registration Change Fees

A. A registration change fee of \$75.00 per change will apply for registration changes where a registered competitor changes into a non-elite category after the registration deadline on March 22, 2024 at 11:59 p.m. PT.



B. A registration change fee of \$100.00 per change will apply for registration changes where a registered competitor changes into an Elite category after the registration deadline on March 22, 2024 at 11:59 p.m. PT.

7.4.3 Refunds

Refunds will only be permitted for medical reasons, with supporting documentation from a healthcare professional, until the final registration deadline on March 22, 2024. Requests for refunds will be assessed on a case-by-case basis.

7.5 Required Participant Documents

<u>All competitors</u> (and the competitor's parent/guardian if the competitor is under 19 years of age) must complete the online Medical History, Waiver, and Release agreement and sign the Participant Code of Conduct agreement prior to the final competitor registration deadline on **Friday, March 22, 2024**, after registering for this event through Sportdata.

All coaches (and the coach's parent/guardian if the coach is under 19 years of age) must sign the online Waiver and Release agreement, the Participant Code of Conduct agreement, and the Accreditation Agreement for Coaches prior to the coach registration deadline on **Friday, March 22, 2024**, after registering for this event through Sportdata.

All referees (and the referee's parent/guardian if the coach is under 19 years of age) must sign the online Waiver and Release agreement and the Participant Code of Conduct agreement prior



to the referee registration deadline on **Friday, March 29, 2024**, after registering for this event through Sportdata.

8.2 Rules of Competition

8.2.1 Individual Kata, Team Kata, Individual Kumite

The 2024 World Karate Federation (WKF) Rules of Competition will be in effect for all Kata and Kumite categories, subject to Karate BC rule modifications (please see section 8.6), and unless otherwise noted in this Information Bulletin.

Kata Competition Rules

Kumite Competition Rules

8.2.2 Para-Karate

The version of the <u>World Karate Federation (WKF) Para-Karate Kata Competition Rules</u> that is in effect at the time of the event will be used for all Para-Karate categories.

8.2.3 Kobudo (Weapons Kata)

The <u>2021 Karate BC Kobudo Competition Rules</u> will be in effect for all Kobudo (Weapons Kata) categories.



8.3 Competition Equipment

The following competition equipment outlined in sections 8.3.1 and 8.3.2 is required for Kata and Kumite competitors, as per the World Karate Federation (WKF) Rules of Competition (with Karate BC rule modifications where applicable). All competition equipment should conform with the designs of WKF-approved equipment, however, they are not required to be WKF-approved. Please note that WKF-approved equipment will not be refused at the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships.

8.3.1 Kata

- A. White Karate-gi
 - Karate-gi with red/blue embroidered brands on the shoulders are permitted (and optional) at this event, and must match the colour assigned for a particular bout. No other colours are permitted. If wearing karate-gi with red/blue embroidery athletes are required to change their karate-gi jacket in the warm-up area, and no extra time will be allotted between bouts for this change.
- B. Red and Blue Belts

8.3.2 Kumite

- A. White Karate-gi
 - Karate-gi with red/blue embroidered brands on the shoulders are permitted (and optional) at this event, and must match the colour assigned for a particular bout. No other colours are permitted. If wearing karate-gi with red/blue embroidery, athletes are required to change their karate-gi jacket in the warm-up area, and no extra time will be allotted between bouts for this change.
- B. Red and Blue Belts
- C. Body Protector
 - Required for all Elite Kumite categories.



- Strongly recommended for all non-Elite Kumite categories
- D. Chest Protector
 - Required for all Elite female Kumite categories
 - Strongly recommended for all non-Elite female Kumite categories
- E. Groin Protector required for all male Kumite categories
- F. Red and Blue Gloves
- G. Red and Blue Foot and Shin Protectors
 - Both colours are required for all Elite Kumite categories
 - Strongly recommended for all non-Elite Kumite categories
- H. Mouth Guard
- I. WKF Helmet Mask
 - Strongly recommended for all under 14 year old Kumite categories
 - Not permitted in any other category
- J. External Body Protector
 - Strongly recommended for all under 14 year old Kumite categories.
 Competitors who choose to wear the external body protector will not be required to wear the body protector (internal), and for female competitors, the chest protector will not be required.
 - Not permitted in any other category

Competitors who choose to compete without wearing the recommended (optional) protective equipment assume all risks of participating without that protection.

8.3.3 Kobudo (Weapons Kata)

The competition equipment outlined in the <u>2021 Karate BC Kobudo Competition Rules</u> is required for all Kobudo categories at this event.

8.3.4 Para-Karate



The competition equipment outlined in the <u>World Karate Federation (WKF) Para-Karate</u> <u>Kata Competition Rules</u> that is in effect at the time of the event is required for all Para-Karate categories in this event.

8.4 Athlete Weigh-In

8.4.1 Requirement to Weigh-In

All athletes in an Elite Kumite category, which can be identified with a category code starting with the letter "E", must successfully complete weigh-in during the official weigh-in periods in order to remain eligible to compete in their Kumite category.

Athletes who fail to weigh-in during the official weigh-in periods will be disqualified from all Elite Kumite categories and will not be eligible to compete in any Elite Kumite categories.

8.4.2 Weigh-In Rules

- A. An athlete is considered to have successfully completed weigh-in if their weight that is measured during an official weigh-in period is within the lower and upper limits of the Kumite weight category for which they are registered, including the permitted weight variances described in section 8.4.4.
- B. Athletes may make as many weigh-in attempts as necessary to successfully complete weigh-in during the official weigh-in periods.
- C. Any athlete who fails to weigh between the lower and upper limits of the Kumite weight category for which they are registered, including the permitted weight variance described in 8.4.4, will be disqualified from that category for failure to comply with weight control restrictions.

8.4.3 Official Weigh-In Periods

Two (2) official weigh-in periods, including a late weigh-in period, will be offered at the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships. Both weigh-in periods will take place at the Richmond Olympic Oval.

Competitors may choose to weigh-in at either of the two weigh-in periods. If an athlete successfully completes weigh-in during the first weigh-in period, they will not be required to attend the second weigh-in period. If an athlete attempts weigh-in during



the first weigh-in period and is unsuccessful, they are permitted to attend the second weigh-in period in order to make subsequent attempts.

- A. Weigh-In Period 1: 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Friday, April 5, 2024
- B. Weigh-In Period 2: 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, April 6, 2024

8.4.4 Permitted Weight Variances

For female U14, Cadet, and Junior Kumite categories, a weight variance of <u>0.5 kg over</u> the normal upper weight limit for a weight category and a weight variance of <u>2.0 kgs</u> below the normal lower weight limit for the weight category will be permitted.

For male U14, Cadet, and Junior Kumite categories, a weight variance of <u>0.2 kg over</u> the normal upper weight limit for a weight category and a weight variance of <u>2.0 kgs</u> below the normal lower weight limit for the weight category will be permitted.

For female U21 and Senior Kumite categories, a weight variance of 0.5 kg over the normal upper weight limit for a weight category and a weight variance of 0.5 kg below the normal lower weight limit for the weight category will be permitted.

For male U21 and Senior Kumite categories, a weight variance of 0.2 kg over the normal upper weight limit for a weight category and a weight variance of 0.2 kg below the normal lower weight limit for the weight category will be permitted.

Examples:

- 1. The weight categories for Female Individual Kumite are: -50 kg, -55 kg, -61 kg, -68 kg, +68 kg. The normal upper weight limit for the -55 kg category is 54.9 kg and the normal lower weight limit is 50.0 kg. Including the 0.5 kg variance, the permissible weight range for this category is from 49.5 kg to 55.4 kg.
- 2. The weight categories for Male Cadet Individual Kumite are: -52 kg, -57 kg, -63 kg, -70 kg, +70 kg. The normal upper weight limit for the -63 kg category is 62.9 kg and the normal lower weight limit is 57.0 kg. Including the 0.2 kg variance for the upper weight limit and the 2.0 kg variance for the lower weight limit, the permissible weight range for this category is from 55.0 kg to 63.1 kg.

8.4.5 Rehearsal Weigh-In



The scales that will be used for the official weigh-in will be made available to athletes for the purpose of rehearsal weigh-in at least 60 minutes prior to the start of each official weigh-in period. Weights measured during rehearsal weigh-in are solely for the athlete's personal use and are not considered official.

8.4.6 Official Weigh-In Protocol

- A. An accurate digital scale that measures weight in kilograms to one decimal place will be used for all official weigh-ins. The scale will be placed on hard, uncarpeted flooring. The maximum discrepancy permitted between the weigh-in scales used for female weigh-in and male weigh-in is 0.1 kg.
- B. Weigh-in for female athletes and male athletes will take place in separate areas. Privacy screens will be installed around the scale.
- C. Two weigh-in officials of the same sex as the athlete weighing in will be present at all times during weigh-in attempts and will administer the weigh-in. One coach of the same sex as the athlete weighing in is permitted to attend the weigh-in attempt to observe the process. Athletes under 19 years of age may have one parent or guardian present during weigh-in in addition to their coach. Coaches and parents/guardians are not permitted to interfere with the weigh in process. Other unauthorized individuals are not permitted in the weigh-in area.
- D. The use of video and/or photo recording devices, including mobile phones, is strictly prohibited in the weigh-in areas.
- E. Athletes must present their official event accreditation card to the weigh-in officials in order to be permitted to attempt weigh-in.
- F. Athletes are to weigh in wearing underclothing only (for females, underwear and bra only, and for males, underwear only). Athletes are not permitted to weigh in nude at the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships. Athletes are not permitted to weigh in with any personal effects on their person.
- G. Athletes will step onto the weigh-in scale once directed to do so by the weigh-in official, and must remain on the scale until directed by the weigh-in official that they may step off of the scale.
- H. Once an athlete has successfully completed weigh-in, the weigh-in official will record the actual weight to one decimal place in the official weight control records.



8.5 Official Protests

Official protests may only be filed for Elite categories at the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships. The protest fee for this event is \$50.00, and must be paid in advance in cash. The fee will be returned if the protest is successful.

8.6 Karate BC Rule Modifications

A table summarizing the competition rules and Karate BC Rule Modifications is available in <u>appendix 1</u> of this Information Bulletin.

8.6.1 Permitted Kata List for Non-Elite Kata Categories

Only Kata listed in the Permitted Kata List for Non-Elite Kata Categories, which is included in <u>appendix 3</u> of this Information Bulletin, may be performed in all non-Elite Kata categories, except for 7 & under Kata categories.

Competitors in merged Kata categories, including Masters Novice to Advanced categories, may perform any Kata that is permitted in the highest skill level of that merged category. For example, competitors in a Masters Novice to Advanced category may perform any Kata permitted in an Advanced category.

8.6.2 Match Duration for Non-Elite Kumite Categories

The match duration for all non-Elite Kumite categories is 1 minute 30 seconds (90 seconds).

8.6.3 Points System for Under 12 Non-Elite Kumite Categories

For non-Elite 7 and Under, 8/9, and 10/11 year old categories, once a competitor accumulates 6 points in a match, the match will end and that competitor will be declared the winner. If both competitors reach 6 points at the same time, standard WKF tie breaking procedures (Senshu/Hantei) will be used to determine the winner.



8.6.4 Contact in Non-Elite Kumite Categories

No contact to the Jodan area with the fist or foot is permitted in any non-Elite Kumite category.

For non-Elite 7 and Under, 8/9, and 10/11 year old categories, contact to the Chudan area is "touch" only - no heavy contact will be permitted.

8.6.5 Novice to Advanced Kobudo Categories

Kihon (basic) Kata will be permitted in Novice to Advanced Kobudo categories.

8.6.6 Non-Elite Team Kata

Bunkai will not be required in non-Elite Team Kata categories for any rounds.

8.7 Elimination Formula

8.7.1 Non-Elite Individual Kata

All Non-Elite Individual Kata categories, except for categories of three competitors, will use the WKF repechage system with flags.

Categories with three competitors will use a round-robin system with flags.

Competitors in under 12 categories will perform their Kata simultaneously.

Competitors in Novice categories as well as Novice competitors in merged Novice categories may repeat the same Kata across rounds.

Competitors in Masters categories may repeat the same Kata across rounds.

Competitors in Intermediate and higher categories (except Masters) as well as Intermediate and higher competitors (except Masters) in merged categories (e.g. Merged Novice and Intermediate category) must, at minimum, alternate between two (2) different Kata across rounds in an "ABAB" manner, where A and B are the names of two different Kata.

8.7.2 Non-Elite Team Kata



All Non-Elite Team Kata categories will use a single round, single pool elimination format with scores. Teams will perform one (1) Kata and will be ranked based on the score obtained from this Kata performance, as per standard WKF rules on assigning scores.

The first, second, third, and fourth place teams after all teams have performed their Kata after the one round will be declared the Gold, Silver, Bronze, and Bronze (as applicable) medallists, respectively.

8.7.3 Non-Elite Individual Kumite

All Non-Elite Individual Kumite categories, except for categories of three competitors, will use the WKF repechage system.

Categories with three competitors will use a round-robin system.

8.7.4 Kobudo (Weapons Kata)

All Kobudo categories will use a single round, single pool elimination format with scores. Competitors will perform one (1) Kata and will be ranked based on the score obtained from this Kata performance, as per standard WKF rules on assigning scores.

The first, second, third, and fourth place competitors after all competitors have performed their Kata after the one round will be declared the Gold, Silver, Bronze, and Bronze (as applicable) medallists, respectively.

8.7.5 Elite Individual Kata

All Elite Individual Kata categories, except for categories of three competitors, will use the WKF repechage system.

Categories with three competitors will use a round-robin system.

An additional match will take place between the two Bronze medallists (the winners of the two repechage draws), where applicable, to determine the true third place athlete. Competitors may repeat a previously-performed Kata in this match.

8.7.6 Elite Individual Kumite



All Elite Individual Kumite categories, except for categories of three competitors, will use the WKF repechage system.

Categories with three competitors will use a round-robin system.

An additional match will take place between the two Bronze medallists (the winners of the two repechage draws), where applicable, to determine the true third place athlete.

8.8 Seeding of Draws

Karate BC will not seed any competitors or teams in draws at the 2024 Karate BC Provincial Championships.

8.9 Separation of Athletes in Draws and Pools

Competitors from the same club will be separated across Kumite draw halves, to the extent possible given the number of total competitors in the category and the number of competitors from that club in the category.

8.10 Re-Draws

Karate BC reserves the right to re-draw categories should the draw become unbalanced due to the absence or withdrawal of a competitor or competitors.

8.11 Merging and Splitting of Categories

Karate BC reserves the right to merge or split non-elite categories at its sole discretion.

Merged categories are considered as a single category for the purpose of awards. Split categories are considered discrete categories for the purpose of awards.

Elite categories will not be merged or split.
